**MAGGIE BRILEY-** EXPRESSED HER CONCERNS ABOUT THE TEMPORARY TAGS BEING EXPIRED AND FROM OUT OF STATE ON THE VEHICLES AT ORLANDO SALVAGE AND HOW WRECKERS COME IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT. MR. BRILEY ASKED WHY PEOPLE WERE LIVING AT ORLANDO SALVAGE AND WHEN THE MESS WAS GOING TO BE CLEANED UP.

**NEW BUSINESS**

THERE WAS NO NEW BUSINESS.

**DEPARTMENT REPORTS:**

**A. PUBLIC WORKS** – RON KNIGHT, PUBLIC WORKS SUPERVISOR, SAID THEY ARE ALMOST DONE INSTALLING THE TWO DRAINS ACROSS FROM CARROLLTON SHEET METAL. WEATHER PERMITTING HINKLE WILL START BLACK TOPPING THIS WEEK.

ROBERT HOFMANN, CODE ENFORCEMENT, SAID WE TALKED WITH TIM STONE ABOUT THE MOTION ACTIVE SINKS FOR THE BATHROOMS AT POINT PARK. SINCE THE MOTION ACTIVE SINKS WERE NOT A PART OF THE ORIGINAL BID MR. HOFMANN TOLD MR. STONE HE WOULD NEED TO SUBMIT A CHANGE ORDER FOR COUNCIL APPROVAL.

**B. UTILITIES** – TERRY ROACH, UTILITIES SUPERVISOR, SAID THE 20/20 GAS PROJECT SHOULD BE COMPLETE BY THE END OF APRIL. THE LOCK ROAD SEWER EXTENSION IS DONE. MATTHEW ADKINS WITH CCCDC IS HELPING CARROLLTON UTILITIES APPLY FOR A GRANT TO GET AN EMERGENCY GENERATOR FOR OUR LARGEST RAW WATER PUMP DOWN OFF OF 6<sup>th</sup> AND MAIN.

**C. TOURISM** – MISTY WHEELER, SAID NEW TOURISM WEBSITE IS FINISHED. CIVIL WAR LIVING HISTORY IS MAY 18-22. CARROLLTON/CARROLL COUNTY TOURISM RECEIVED AN EDA GRANT IN THE AMOUNT OF \$17,817 TO BE USED ON ADVERTISEMENT. TOURISM HAS INVITED PEOPLE TO COME TO CARROLLTON TO SEE IF IT IS POSSIBLE TO HAVE A MARINA AND MATTHEW ADKINS WITH CCCDC IS LOOKING FOR GRANTS.

**D. POLICE DEPARTMENT** – MIKE WILLHOITE, POLICE CHIEF, SAID JACOB STEWART WILL START APRIL 22<sup>nd</sup> AND WILL ATTEND THE POLICE ACADEMY STARTING MAY 9<sup>th</sup>. DON MULHALL HAS COMPLETED ALL THREE LEVELS OF SRO TRAINING.

**E. FIRE DEPARTMENT** – MIKE TERRELL, FIRE CHIEF, SAID IT'S BEEN A BUSY MONTH WITH FIRE RUNS AND THE LARGE FIRE DOWNTOWN. HAVE BEEN DOING SOME MINOR MAINTENANCE TO THE FIRE TRUCKS.

**F. CODE ENFORCEMENT** – ROBERT HOFMANN SAID THE CITY CLEAN UP DAY WILL BE SATURDAY, APRIL 23<sup>rd</sup> FROM 8 A.M. UNTIL 2 P.M. AT THE CORNER OF 2<sup>nd</sup> STREET AND HIGH STREET. P&Z IS ALMOST DONE WORKING ON THE CITY'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN.

MR. HOFMANN REPORTED THE CODE ENFORCEMENT BOARD HAS ONE RECOMMENDATION FROM TODAY'S MEETING TO ABATE THE PROPERTY AT 318 WARE AVE. THIS PROPERTY WAS CITED FOR RUBBISH AND INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLE.
