DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

- **A. PUBLIC WORKS** RON KNIGHT, PUBLIC WORKS SUPERVISOR, SAID PUBLIC WORKS HAS BEEN WORKING ON STORM DRAINS ON 11th STREET AND 3 CULVERTS ON 9th STREET. THE TRAIL HEAD MARKERS DAMAGED BY THE FLOOD WATERS ARE READY TO BE REINSTALLED. PUBLIC WORKS HAS LOTS OF MOWING TO DO. MAYOR ADAMS SAID HE CALLED KU TODAY ABOUT THE DAMAGED LIGHT POLES ALONG THE RIVERWALK. KU IS CHECKING INTO DIFFERENT STYLES OF LIGHT POLES FOR THE RIVERWALK.
- **B. UTILITIES** BILL OSBORNE, UTILITIES SUPERVISOR, SAID THERE HAS BEEN SOME INDUSTRIAL ACTIVITY. CARROLLTON UTILITIES IS EXTENDING GAS SERVICE TO MID CONTINENT COAL & COAK OFF HUNTERS HEIGHTS AND RELOCATED A GAS LINE FOR FERRALLOY. THE ANNUAL LEAK SURVEY FOR GAS IS UNDERWAY AS WELL AS THE ANNUAL VALVE MAINTENANCE AND FLUSHING OF HYDRANTS NEXT WEEK.
- C. CCCDC SHELBY MILES, CCCDC DIRECTOR, SAID HE IS WORKING ON A COUPLE OF GRANTS FOR THE CITY. A LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION GRANT THAT WOULD TARGET A SUPPORTING STRUCTURE LIKE A NEW BATHROOM AT POINT PARK. THE GRANT WOULD BE A 50/50 MATCH WITH A FUNDING RANGE OF \$25,000 UP TO \$250,000 AND THE DEADLINE IS MAY 31st. THE TAP GRANT WOULD HELP FUND THE SIDEWALK PROJECT ON CLAY STREET BETWEEN 7th AND 11th STREET. THE TAP GRANT IS FEDERAL FUNDED WITH A 20% MATCH.
- **D. POLICE DEPARTMENT** MIKE WILLHOITE, POLICE CHIEF, WAS NOT PRESENT.

MAYOR ADAMS SAID THE 11th STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT IS MOVING RIGHT ALONG. MAYOR ADAMS ASKED COUNCIL TO BE THINKING ABOUT HOW THEY WOULD LIKE TO SELL AND A DOLLAR AMOUNT FOR THE PROPERTY AT 704 11th STREET.

MAYOR ADAMS: SAID THE CARROLL COUNTY FAIR GROUND IS HAVING A DEMO DERBY ON MAY 8th AT 7:00 P.M. THE CIVIL WAR LIVING HISTORY EVENT IS THIS WEEK. THE CITY CLERK TREASURER, MELINDA WRIGHT-MOORE, WILL BE OUT NEXT WEEK FOR TRAINING.
