**DISCUSSION – PICKLE BALL COURTS AT POINT PARK**

MAYOR ADAMS MENTIONS THAT THE CITY IS LOOKING AT PUTTING IN PICKLE BALL COURTS AT POINT PARK. THE ESTIMATED COST WOULD BE \$41000, PUBLIC WORKS WOULD PUT DOWN THE BASE GRAVEL AND LEVELING. OHIO VALLEY ASPHALT WOULD LAY 4” ASPHALT. ANOTHER COMPANY WOULD SURFACE, STRPE, INSTALL POLES & NET ON COURTS. AN ANOTHER COMPANY WOULD INSTALL BLACK COATED FENCE. MAYOR ADAMS THAT THERE WAS \$51000 IN ARPA MONEY SET ASIDE FOR PLAYGROUNDS AND THE CITY OF GOOD WITH PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT
