STREET LIGHTS

MAYOR ADAMS SAID TODAY AT THE HOUSING AUTHORITY MEETING THERE WAS A REQUEST FOR STREET LIGHTS OFF OF 10th STREET BETWEEN BAKER DRIVE AND KATHRYN WINN SCHOOL. THERE WAS SOME DISCUSSION. MAYOR ADAMS SAID NOTHING NEEDS TO BE DECIDED ON TONIGHT AND DISCUSSION WILL BE POSTPONE UNTIL THE NEXT COUNCIL MEETING.

ADMIN WINDOW

MAYOR ADAMS SAID COUNCIL NEEDS TO CONSIDER REPLACING THE ADMIN WINDOW. CURRENTLY THERE IS A PIECE OF WOOD IN THE TRACK TO KEEP THE WINDOW FROM OPENING UP ALL THE WAY AND EVERY TIME THE LOBBY DOORS OPEN THE WINDOW RATTLES. THE NEW WINDOW NEEDS TO BE ENCLOSED WITH A SPEAKER AND HAVE A TRANSACTION STATION LIKE THE POLICE DEPARTMENT'S

WINDOW. THERE WAS SOME DISCUSSION. MAYOR ADAMS SAID HE WOULD GET A QUOTE TOGETHER FOR THE ADMIN WINDOW.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

- A. PUBLIC WORKS RON KNIGHT, PUBLIC WORKS SUPERVISOR, WAS NOT PRESENT.
- **B. UTILITIES** BILL OSBORNE, UTILITIES SUPERVISOR, SAID CREWS ARE ABOUT FINISHED WITH THE SEWER MAIN EXTENSION ON OBIE COOK ROAD IN OWEN COUNTY. THIS PROJECT IS BEING PARTIALLY FUNDED BY THE CDBG GRANT. THE 20/20 GAS PROJECT IS ABOUT TO START THIS WEEK ALONG US42 AND BLUE LICK ROAD. CARROLLTON UTILITIES IS SEEING AN INCREASE IN NEW GAS SERVICES FOR RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS WANTING TO CONVERT TO GAS TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF LOW COST AND WARMER HEAT. THERE WAS A RECENT PUBLIC REPORT ON PROJECTED WINTER BILL INCREASES. CARROLLTON UTILITIES RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL CUSTOMERS ARE MOSTLY PROTECTED FROM THAT DUE TO PRICES THAT WERE LOCKED IN SEVERAL YEARS AGO.
- **C. CCCDC** SHELBY MILES, CCCDC DIRECTOR, SAID THE TAP GRANT HAS BEEN SUBMITTED IN THE AMOUNT OF \$220,000 AND SHOULD KNOW BY THE END OF THE YEAR IF THE GRANT IS APPROVED.
- **D. TOURISM** MISTY WHEELER, TOURISM DIRECTOR, SAID LAST WEEKEND WAS THE TWO RIVERS BASS TOURNAMENT. THERE WERE 29 TEAMS AND THE GRAND PRICE WAS \$5,000.00.
- E. POLICE DEPARTMENT MIKE WILLHOITE, POLICE CHIEF, SAID THERE WAS NO MONTHLY REPORT SENT OUT LAST WEEK BECAUSE PENNY MAIDEN, POLICE CLERK, WAS OUT LAST WEEK. JUST A REMINDER TRICK OR TREAT IS ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 30th, 2021 FROM 6:00 P.M. 8:00 P.M. THERE WERE NO ARRESTS MADE AT THE TOBACCO FESTIVAL. THE POLICE DEPARTMENT IS STILL LOOKING TO HIRE ONE MORE OFFICER. PENNY MAIDEN, POLICE CLERK, ANNOUNCED SHE WILL BE RETIRING ON OCTOBER 28th, 2021 AFTER BEING WITH THE CITY FOR 31 YEARS. HER REPLACEMENT, LISA KYLE, WILL START WITH THE CITY ON OCTOBER 18th, 2021. HANK THE K-9 DOG IS STILL RECOVERING AND WILL BE ABLE TO KEEP HIS INJURED LEG. COUNCILMAN GORDON ASKED WHEN THE BIKE PATROL WAS GOING TO START AGAIN. CHIEF WILLHOITE SAID THE BICYCLES ARE IN GOOD SHAPE BUT THERE ARE NEW GUIDELINES TO BIKE PATROLLING. ONE OF THE REQUIREMENTS IS THAT 2 CERTIFIED BIKE POLICE OFFICERS MUST PATROL TOGETHER. THE POLICE DEPARTMENT ONLY HAS ONE CERTIFIED BIKE POLICE OFFICER AND THERE ARE NO CLASSES BEING OFFERED AT THIS TIME FOR BIKE PATROL TRAINING.
