MAYOR ADAMS SAID HE HAS A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE DESIGN REVIEW BOARD TO APPROVE THE EIP 50-50 MATCHING FUNDS APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY BLOOMS FLORAL STUDIO FOR SIGNAGE AT 519 HIGHLAND AVE. THE TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT FOR THE SIGNAGE IMPROVEMENTS AT 519 HIGHLAND AVE CAME TO \$848.

DISCUSSION ON EIP 50-50 MATCHING FUNDS / SIGNAGE FOR DAILEY TAX SERVICE

MAYOR ADAMS SAID HE HAS A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE DESIGN REVIEW BOARD TO APPROVE THE EIP 50-50 MATCHING FUNDS APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY DAILEY TAX SERVICE FOR SIGNAGE AT 210 6th STREET. THE TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT FOR THE SIGNAGE IMPROVEMENTS AT 210 6th STREET CAME TO \$525.

DISCUSSION ON EIP 50-50 MATCHING FUNDS / FACADE FOR FRANK BARTLEY

MAYOR ADAMS SAID HE HAS A RECOMMENDATION FROM THE DESIGN REVIEW BOARD TO APPROVE THE EIP 50-50 MATCHING FUNDS APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY FRANK BARTLEY FOR FACADE AT 202 6th STREET. THE TOTAL DOLLAR AMOUNT FOR THE FACADE IMPROVEMENTS AT 202 6th STREET CAME TO \$4,596. THE RENTAL FEE OF A MAN-LIFT WAS INCLUDED IN MR. BARTLEY'S APPLICATION. MAYOR ADAMS SAID HE BELIEVES MR. BARTLEY IS THE OWNER OF THE MAN-LIFT. MAYOR ADAMS RECOMMENDS TAKING OFF \$1,250 OF THE TOTAL COST OF THE FACADE IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE RENTAL FEE OF THE MAN-LIFT BRING THE NEW TOTAL TO \$3.346.

MAYOR ADAMS SAID IN 2018 THE EIP WAS UPDATED TO INCLUDE THE RENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM. MAYOR ADAMS BELIEVES THE AWNING, FACADE, AND SIGNAGE PORTION OF THE EIP IS PUTTING THE CITY AT RISK. MAYOR ADAMS RECOMMENDS THAT COUNCIL SHOULD HAVE A SPECIAL COUNCIL MEETING TO DISCUSS THE EIP AND TO SUSPEND THE AWNING, FACADE, AND SIGNAGE PORTION OF THE EIP UNTIL AFTER THE SAID MEETING.

CARROLL COUNTY LIBRARY

MAYOR ADAMS SAID THE LIBRARY PARKING LOT CONTRACT IS ENDING SOON AND HAS STARTED HAVING MEETING WITH THE LIBRARY BOARD TO FULFILL THE LIBRARY'S CONTRACTUAL OBLIGATIONS.

11th STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT

MAYOR ADAMS SAID THE 11th STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT IS MOVING ALONG AND ONLY NEED A FEW MORE EASEMENTS SIGNED AND BELIEVES THERE SHOULD NOT BE ANY PROBLEMS.

NEW BUSINESS

THERE WAS NO NEW BUSINESS

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

A. POLICE DEPARTMENT – MIKE WILLHOITE, POLICE CHIEF, SAID ON FEBRUARY 26th THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HELD INTERVIEWS FOR THE ASSISTANT POLICE CHIEF

POSITION. CHIEF WILLHOITE ANNOUNCED ANDY SISENSTEIN AS THE NEW ASSISTANT POLICE CHIEF. WITH MR. SISENSTEIN'S PROMOTION A SERGEANT POSITION OPENED UP ALLOWING KEITH DEWS TO BE PROMOTED TO SERGEANT. WITH TIM MITCHELL LEAVING THE DEPARTMENT LEFT AN OPEN SPOT TO HIRE A NEW OFFICER. ON FRIDAY, MARCH 19th, 2021 AARON BLANTON WILL JOIN THE CARROLLTON POLICE DEPARTMENT. THE LAST FEW DAYS THE POLICE DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN TRAINING WITH THE NEW CAD SYSTEM AND IS GOING LIVE ON THURSDAY.

B. PUBLIC WORKS – RON KNIGHT, PUBLIC WORKS SUPERVISOR, SAID PUBLIC WORKS HAS BEEN CLEANING UP MUD ALONG THE RIVERWALK TODAY DUE TO HIGH WATER. THERE ARE SIX LAMP POSTS MISSING AND THE HANDRAIL WAS BENT. MR. KNIGHT SAID HE HAS THREE ITEMS HE WOULD LIKE TO HAVE SURPLUS AND SOLD BY SEALED BID. THESE THREE ITEMS ARE NO LONGER BEING USED OR HAVE BEEN REPLACED WITH NEW EQUIPMENT. A 1996 BUNTON LAWNMOWER WITH A 60 INCH CUTTING DECK, A GM 1190R FRONTIER 90 INCH CUT FINISH MOWER FOR A TRACTOR, AND A LAND PRIDE 90 INCH CUT FINISH MOWER FOR A TRACTOR.

THE MOTION WAS MADE BY COUNCILMAN GORDON AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN DICKOW AND DULY CARRIED TO DECLARE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS, WHICH ARE FURTHER DESCRIBED ON THE ATTACHED LIST, AS SURPLUS: A 1996 BUNTON LAWNMOWER WITH A 60 INCH CUTTING DECK, A GM 1190R FRONTIER 90 INCH CUT FINISH MOWER FOR A TRACTOR, AND A LAND PRIDE 90 INCH CUT FINISH MOWER FOR A TRACTOR, AS SAME HAS EXCEEDED ITS USEFUL LIFE AND IS NO LONGER USED BY PUBLIC WORKS AND TO AND SELL SAME BY ACCEPTING SEALED BIDS AS PERMITTED BY LAW.

- C. UTILITIES BILL OSBORNE, UTILITIES SUPERVISOR, SAID NATURAL GAS IS SEEING RECORD GAS USAGE OVER THE PAST THREE MONTHS. MID-FEBRUARY WAS CHALLENGING FROM AN OPERATIONAL VIEWPOINT DUE TO THE PEAK USAGE AND THEN FINANCIALLY DUE TO EXCESSIVE SPIKES IN DAILY GAS PRICING. FORTUNATELY, CARROLLTON UTILITIES HAD ENOUGH GAS STORAGE TO AVOID PURCHASING GAS DURING THE SHORT-TERM SPIKE IN PRICING. THE 20/20 PROJECT RECEIVED WORD OF A \$2 MILLION GRANT TO GO TOWARDS THE CONSTRUCTION COST. CARROLLTON UTILITIES IS WAITING ON APPROVALS FROM EDA AND CORPS OF ENGINEERS TO ADVERTISE FOR BID. THE FLOODING LAST WEEK CAUSED A LIMITED AMOUNT OF DAMAGE.
- **D. CCCDC** SHELBY MILES, CCCDC DIRECTOR, SAID THE MULTIPLE ERGONOMIC WORK STATIONS AND THE VOICE RECORDING SYSTEM GRANTS HAVE BEEN SUBMITTED AND WAITING APPROVAL. THE SEARCH FOR A DOG PARK GRANT HAS BEEN UNSUCCESSFUL. STILL WAITING ON APPROVAL FOR THE GRANT SUBMITTED LAST YEAR FOR THE HOUSING AUTHORITY TO INSTALL COMBO SMOKE AND CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS.
