# **MAYOR'S BUDGET MESSAGE FOR FY 2018-19**

MAYOR ADAMS READ HIS BUDGET MESSAGE. HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDED INCREASES IN HEALTH INSURANCE, COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENTS FOR EMPLOYEES, AND UNFUNDED MANDATES FROM THE LEGISLATURE FOR THE PENSION SHORTFALL. THIS BUDGET DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY NEW AMENITIES FOR THE RIVERFRONT DEVELOPMENT. THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WILL BE GETTING ONE NEW CRUISER. THEY WILL ALSO RECEIVE NEW RADIOS AND SUPPORTING EQUIPMENT TO HELP INCREASE LIFE SAFETY FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT. THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT WILL BE GETTING A NEW TRUCK TO REPLACE A 17 YEAR OLD VEHICLE. YEARLY SIDEWALK PROJECTS AND ASPHALTING WILL CONTINUE AS USUAL.

### **CARROLLTON UTILITIES BUDGET MESSAGE FOR FY 2018-19**

BILL OSBORNE, CARROLLTON UTILITIES MANAGER, PRESENTED HIS BUDGET MESSAGE FOR FY 2018-19.

GAS REVENUES ARE PROJECTED TO INCREASE 2.2%. GAS TRANSPORTATION REVENUES ARE EXPECTED TO DECREASE LESS THAN 1%. THE NEW ADMINISTRATION BUILDING CAME IN LESS THAN WAS BUDGETED. A NEW METER STATION AT NAS, A NEW SERVICE LINE FOR PMC, AND A NEW BOILER AT WRIGHT'S RIDGE ARE UNDERWAY AND INCLUDED IN THE BUDGETS. NEW GAS SERVICES AT NUCOR AND CABOT ARE ALSO INCLUDED.

THE SEWAGE DEPARTMENT IS PROPOSING A 2% INCREASE IN TOWN AND 3% OUT OF TOWN. A \$200,000 SOLAR AERATION SYSTEM TO REDUCE ELECTRICITY CONSUMPTION WILL BE EVALUATED AND IS INCLUDED IN THE BUDGET. AS PART OF THE PURCHASE OF THE CAMPBELLSBURG WASTEWATER COLLECTION SYSTEM, CAMPBELLSBURG PAID CARROLLTON FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF TWO OLD PUMPING STATIONS. THE \$1.5 MILLION ICE (INDUSTRIAL CAPACITY EXPANSION) PROJECT IS IN

THE NEW BUDGET. THE PROJECT IS EXPECTED TO BE FUNDED VIA A 50-80% GRANT FROM EDA.

THE GREENSAND WATER PLANT PROJECT WILL BE COMPLETED. NO INCREASES IN WATER RATES.

THERE WILL ALSO BE 3% INCREASE IN EMPLOYEE WAGES, 7% FOR HEALTH INSURANCE, AND CERS INCREASE.
