CALL TO ORDER:

THE MEETING WAS CALLED TO ORDER AT THE HOUR OF 7:00 P.M. BY MAYOR LOUDEN WHO OFFERED THE INVOCATION AND LED THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.

SHE SAID THE SAME CARS AND MESS ARE STILL ACROSS THE STREET FROM HER HOME. SHE WANTED TO KNOW IF THERE WAS ANY UPDATE. MAYOR LOUDEN SAID WE ARE WORKING ON IT.

ADAM MCNEESE

HE EXPRESSED SOME CONCERNS HE HAD ABOUT THE RENTAL DWELLING PERMIT ORDINANCE. HE FELT THAT THE CITY IS CREATING ANOTHER TASK FOR PROPERTY OWNERS. MR. MCNEESE WAS ALSO CONCERNED ABOUT THE DEFINITION OF RENTAL INSPECTOR IN THE ORDINANCE STATING IT CAN BE ANY EMPLOYEE DESIGNATED BY THE CITY MAYOR OR HIS/HER DESIGNEE, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS EMPLOYED BY THE CODE ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT. MAYOR LOUDEN SAID HE WOULD ONLY DESIGNATE A CERTIFIED INSPECTOR. HE ALSO STATED HE WASN'T AWARE OF THE CITY ADOPTING THE INTERNATIONAL HOUSING CODE. HE WAS GOING BY THE KENTUCKY HOUSING CODE. THERE NEEDS TO BE BETTER COMMUNICATION FROM THE CITY TO RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS WHEN CHANGES ARE MADE. MAYOR LOUDEN SAID IF RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS WOULD TAKE CARE OF THEIR PROPERTIES, THE CITY WOULDN'T HAVE TO HAVE THIS
